## ***Arrival and Departure Information***

Opening Day: **Sunday, June 27 and Monday, July 26**

Most Waukeela parents bring their children to camp; we certainly recommend this for first-time Waukeela girls. Plan to arrive between 9:00 – 11:00 AM. Please note that cabin beds will be allocated randomly, so despite your daughter's entreaties, there is no reason to arrive earlier than 9:00!!

Upon your arrival, our CIT's (counselors-in-training) will take you and your daughter to her cabin, assisting with her luggage, and introduce you to her counselor. We encourage you to spend time helping your daughter unpack, making her bed, and meeting her other cabin-mates. You will also visit the infirmary to meet the camp nurse, deliver any medications your daughter may have brought to camp, and provide any information you wish our nurses to know. There your child will be inspected for head lice; please note she will not be allowed to stay in camp should any evidence of nits be discovered. Finally, you will be directed to the camp office where the staff will make sure you have provided all the data and forms we need, and take care of any questions or requests you have at that time. All of the above can be accomplished in less than an hour. We find from years of experience that it is better not to extend your departure beyond this time. Many thanks for your understanding and help with this!

Lunch (at noon) of Opening Day is the first official camp activity for the session. Please note that parents are **not** invited to this meal as we simply don't have the space to feed you and there are many announcements on which we want the campers to be focusing!

For campers who are not brought to camp by their parents, Waukeela provides small group transportation from the airports in Boston, MA. and Portland, ME. Staff members will meet each camper's flight and, when everyone who is awaited has arrived, transport them in camp vehicles to Eaton Center. Please note that some wait time is to be expected. To keep this to a minimum and to make sure everyone can be at camp for the Green and White ceremonies immediately after dinner, it is important that you schedule your daughter to arrive between 10:30 AM and 2:30 PM. If you have not already done so, please make your flight reservations ASAP, as most camps in New England open on the same weekend and flights to the region on those days fill up fast! **Please note that we will not pick up in Manchester, NH this summer – there are many discounted airlines now flying to Boston and Portland, and these are much more convenient places to get to and from Waukeela than Manchester.**

One-way shuttle service via the camp's vans costs \$85.00. (\$75.00 if Portland). Please note that in order for your child to be picked up at one of these airports, we must receive her travel information no later than **Monday, June 21st** for Session 1 campers and **Monday, July 14<sup>th</sup>** for Session 2 campers. This enables us to have the required number of staff members in the appropriate terminals at the appropriate times – a logistics challenge that is complicated immensely by last minute information flow! Should you subsequently need to change your daughter's travel plans, please notify us ASAP.

## Closing Day

First Session will end **Saturday, July 24th** at 3:00 PM, the close of our traditional Parents Weekend (see page 9-10). If you plan to pick up your daughter at camp, you must do so by that time. If your daughter is coming for both sessions and you attend the festivities planned for that day, you may take her out of camp at this time, bringing her back either Sunday afternoon/evening or Monday morning. Please let us know in advance of that weekend what your plans are in this regard.

If your daughter will be flying home at the end of First Session, Waukeela will provide transportation to either Boston or Portland airports on the morning of **Sunday, July 25<sup>th</sup>**. We ask that you schedule your daughter's flight to depart between 9:00-12:00 AM that day. A staff member will accompany each camper to her departure gate and wait there until her plane has left the ground.

Second Session will end **Saturday, August 21st** at Noon. This will enable 2<sup>nd</sup> session parents to watch camper performances that morning in the same way that 1<sup>st</sup> Session parents have long enjoyed. See page 10 for details of the "mini-Parents Day" we are planning that Saturday.

If your daughter will be flying home after 2<sup>nd</sup> session, she will be transported to the airport **Saturday** morning (**August 21st**). We ask that you schedule her flight between 9:00-12:00 AM from either Boston or Portland. As noted above, a staff member will escort each camper to her departure gate and wait until her plane has left the ground.

**Please note the pick-up day for 2-week campers is Sunday, July 11<sup>th</sup> for 1<sup>st</sup> session and Sunday, August 8<sup>th</sup> for 2<sup>nd</sup> session. Parents should arrive in time to attend the 11:30 AM Appreciation Service, and are welcome to stay for lunch with us thereafter.**

## ***Communications to and from Eaton Center***

*We encourage frequent written correspondence between you and your daughter at camp and phone calls should you wish to correspond with any member of the camp administration. We discourage phone communication between you and your child, however, and ask that you restrict it to the circumstances described below.*

### Camp-bound Mail and Packages

Nothing is quite so satisfying, and reassuring, to a camper as receiving letters from home; please write your daughter often. Even though your daughter may not respond in kind, we've yet to find a camper who does not read her mail voraciously!

Parents may also send email and faxes to their children, which office staff deliver as quickly as we can. For parents seeking rapid and assured delivery, an "express" email

service is available for approximately \$1.00 per message. You may sign up for this service on the “Photos and Emails” page of the Current Parents section of our website. Further info about email options will follow in our spring newsletter.

Although it is very common for children to ask for and receive “care packages” at camp, Waukeela has a strictly enforced rule that no candy, gum or food of any sort is to be brought or sent to camp. All packages are opened in the presence of office staff who will confiscate any food items which are found. Please be aware that sending food or gum to your child puts her in a double-bind: she will be upset when she is not allowed to take it, and you will have sent her a message that it is okay to break camp rules!

#### Out-Bound Mail

Campers are invited to write or fax home frequently and are required to write home each Sunday (international campers are allowed to fax all their letters home). The camper’s Sunday letter is accompanied by a letter from her counselor, providing details of her week’s activities.

Campers are not allowed to send outbound e-mail. Waukeela does not have enough computers to handle the volume, and we think parents are special enough to deserve something hand-written from their kids!

#### Telephone Calls

Every Waukeela girl has an adjustment to make from living at home with her family to feeling at home at camp. For some this may happen very quickly; for others it may require several days. Although it is natural for campers and parents to want to talk to one another during this adjustment period, experience shows that such conversations often prolong whatever adjustment problems may exist. For this reason, we do not allow campers to speak with their parents during the first two weeks of each session. This rule applies to all campers, whether new or returning, and whether homesick or not.

Parents who wish to learn about and discuss how things are going during this time period (and certainly at any other time as well) are welcome to call the Director. If, as a result of such discussion, we mutually conclude it will be beneficial for you to speak with your child, this will be quickly arranged.

After the first two weeks of each session, children are allowed to call home once a week if they so desire. However such calls can only be made following mealtimes: 8:15-9:15 AM, 12:15-1:15 PM, and 6:15-7:30 PM. Your daughter will need to use a phone card or call collect, and her conversation will be restricted to a maximum of five minutes since others will also wish to use our phone lines at these times.

Parent-originated calls directly to campers are limited to emergency situations only. More often than not, such calls tend to be disruptive in a residential camp environment - if not for your child when you call her, then for the other children and staff members she

happens to be with. Thus if you wish to speak by phone with your daughter, please phone, fax, or email the office (at any time of the day or night) with your request, and let us know the next mealtimes (see above) when it will be convenient for her to call you back. We will deliver your message to her, and make every effort to ensure that she calls back per your instructions within the next 24 hours. Please note that you may use either of the camp's phone lines to leave such a message: (603)447-2260 or (603) 447-4906.

While not eliminating conversations between parents and kids while they are at Waukeela, our phone policy is designed to encourage your written communication. Whereas receiving letters and faxes and emails from you are always an enjoyable experience for your child, verbal contact may often be unsettling – for one or the other or both parties involved. By definition, writing is a more reflective activity, and our experience shows it thus offers a more subtle and satisfying information exchange than the immediate but transitory gratification of a breathless, too-short phone conversation. We very much appreciate your understanding of this policy. Note, however, that should *anything* happen at camp that worries or bothers you while your daughter is in our care, *please do not hesitate to contact the Director directly*. Unless you do so, it is unlikely he will know anything about it. Phone, rather than email, is by far the best way to reach him. He does not always find the time to check his email when camp is in session. But he always sees his phone messages, and will get back to you ASAP if you leave him one!

### Pre-camp Communications

A late spring newsletter is mailed to all families with news about the upcoming summer's program and staff. It is written with both campers and their parents in mind, but it is not unusual for new parents to be the most interested in the information provided!

Prior to camp, each first-time Waukeela girl will receive a letter from her “camp sister” – a returning camper who'll share a little bit about herself and invite your daughter to correspond with her. The camp sister will also seek your child out on Opening Day to introduce herself and help welcome your daughter to camp.

### **Visiting**

During or after the second weekend of each session, visits are permitted, but not encouraged, for anyone who would like to spend time with their daughter(s). On the one hand, we are proud of what goes on at Waukeela and like having parents understand better what their daughters experience here. On the other hand, such visits are often distracting and can produce homesickness for your child as well as for others in her cabin. Please call in advance if you wish to visit, both to let us know you are coming and to make sure your daughter will not be out on a trip when you arrive. Please note that we prefer that you not take your child out of camp during your visit, and require that you receive pre-arranged approval of the Director if you wish to do so.

The vast majority of our parents do not visit camp except to drop off and pick up their children (despite what you may hear from them!). Because of this, we do schedule some special events at the close of each session to give parents a taste of what goes on.

“Parents Weekend” is a Friday night/all-day Saturday showcase of our camper’s talents at the end of First Session. For parents who can arrive Friday evening, a “talent show” highlights a very low-key Open House from 7:30-8:30 PM. Saturday’s activities begin at 9:30 AM, include a luncheon feast and drama presentation thereafter, and end about 3:00 PM with a final Appreciation Service in our outdoor amphitheatre. Please plan to stay for all of Saturday’s activities, as staff and campers have worked hard on each of them!

Parents of Second Session campers are invited to join us at 8:30 AM **Saturday, August 21st** for a “mini-Parents Day” celebration featuring various camper performances. These may include one or more short plays and shows by our horseback riders and synchronized swimmers, depending on camper interest. All performances will be finished by Noon at the latest, enabling a very early afternoon departure after any last minute packing and the expected tearful farewells!!

If you plan to stay overnight in the area, please make your reservations early. Although there are many places to stay near Waukeela, almost every residential camp in New England operates on or near the same session schedule. Lodging for the weekend when our sessions change, in particular, should be booked well in advance.

Waukeela is located 6 miles south of Conway, N.H. on RTE 153. The towns closest to camp, in order of proximity, are Eaton, Snowville, Madison, Freedom, Conway and North Conway. For more lodging, you may call the Mount Washington Valley Chamber of Commerce (800-367-3364) .

## ***Health Care Matters***

Waukeela has a registered nurse on site at all times and a four bed health center to house children who do not feel well. It is camp policy to store all medications, including over the counter drugs, under lock and key in the health center. The nurse will distribute each child's medication on the prescribed schedule and administer it where necessary. An exception to this rule is that children requiring inhalers may keep one with them at all times as long as they have one in the infirmary and parental permission to self-medicate as needed.

A camp physician and a camp dentist are always on call, whose pediatric offices are less than five miles up the road in the town of Conway. Emergency care and hospital services are provided at Memorial Hospital, the largest medical facility in central New Hampshire, located 10 miles away in North Conway.

Prior to starting camp, you are required to submit a Health History and Examination Form (enclosed in this mailing; also on our website) for your child, which has been signed by a licensed Medical Person within the six month period of time before she arrives at camp. This form contains a release, to be signed by you, providing the camp with the ability to authorize medical care for your daughter should we be unable to reach you in the event of an emergency. A copy of this form travels with your daughter on any trip she may take off of the camp's property.

Please note that we cannot accept your daughter in camp without having received this form, signed both by you and her doctor. Please carefully follow the instructions attached to the form, and fax or mail it back to Eaton Center prior to your child's arrival. This year there will be a special "fast lane" at the Infirmary on Opening Day for any child whose health form has arrived at least a week before her session begins.

## ***Food***

Everyone dines together family-style at Waukeela with campers taking turns as waiters and bus-girls. Meals are planned for their nutritional value, but also to appeal to the taste buds of young women! All cooking is done on the premises by the camp chef, who specializes in pastas, fresh salads, and bakery items. A vegetarian option is served at all meals. Special dietary needs are met if clearly stated on a camper's registration and health forms.

We attempt to moderate the sugar-intake of our campers by not serving any soda at camp, by providing fresh fruit as an afternoon snack, and by generally serving light desserts at lunch and dinner. A child's sweet tooth will be satisfied by the much-beloved Waukeela tradition of celebrating "Candy Day" three times a week, in which she is entitled to choose a free candy bar after lunch from the "store" run by our CITs. As noted earlier, we

strictly adhere to a policy of confiscating any food which is mailed to your child, and ask that all her friends and relatives at home respect this policy and the reasons for it.

## ***What to Bring and Wear***

Girls wear a camp uniform at Waukeela during the day, consisting primarily of dark green or white tee shirts and shorts. We believe it is important that our campers not have to worry about what they wear, and we think that wearing the camp's colors helps to build the shared sense of community we seek. Waukeela girls are allowed to wear something different after 5:00 PM; about half of the camp changes into a tee shirt of a different color, and the other half can't be bothered!

Each spring we mail to new camp parents a catalogue from the camp's uniform supplier (Amerasport) which offers, for your convenience, every item your child could conceivably use at camp. The catalogue also contains a list showing what items she is required to bring – a considerably shorter list to be sure! Both new and returning families may access the catalogue and the required clothing list from the “Camp Uniform” page on the Current Parents section of the Waukeela website. Please note you may buy any of the required clothing items from Amerasport with the Waukeela camp logo, or you can buy such clothing, without the logo, from any other vendor you would like. Most girls enjoy having at least some clothes emblazoned with the camp's name and logo, and have no problem wearing these items when they get home!

Camp families order from our uniform supplier directly, but the clothes may be shipped to your home or to camp. Since the vast majority of Waukeela girls return to camp for several years, most parents order camp clothes in larger sizes than what would fit their child today. We strongly suggest that you order any uniform items early – ideally by the end of March. Also should you have questions or experience difficulty with the ordering process, please contact us directly to share your concerns.

Trunks, duffel bags, and large packages may be shipped to camp by UPS and many other carriers. Since such carriers won't deliver to a POB, however, please note that the street address you need to provide is: Camp Waukeela, Rte. 153 and Brownfield Road, Eaton Center, N.H. 03832

Laundry is sent out for cleaning on Mondays, and is returned by Thursday of each week. Thus at a minimum, your daughter will need an 11-day supply of clothes. The suggested quantities in the supplier's catalogue are higher than this, reflecting the fact that clothes will get wet, lost, etc., and some girls will tolerate dirt and dampness during the day much more than others. Please take into consideration your own daughter's personality as you decide how much clothing she brings. **Also note that she will need 2 laundry bags!** Separately, we have enclosed a list of some Frequently Asked Questions about what equipment and “other stuff” your daughter should (and should not) bring from home. Please note that the volume of material that girls bring to camp seems to increase every year for reasons that may be obvious to them but are still mysterious to the Director!!

## Money and other Valuables at Camp

There is a safe in the camp office where plane tickets, travel money, or valuable items your daughter brings to camp can be stored. Please note, however, that she will not need any cash at camp; nor is there a need to bring jewelry or other personal items which have significant value.

The office staff operates a “supply room” where items such as toothpaste, shampoo, bug spray or stamps will be provided on an “emergency” basis at no cost to any camper who needs them. Having used the supply room once, however, your daughter will be asked to request additional items of this nature from home.

## ***Billing and Payment***

Once we receive your child’s registration form and deposit, the information you have submitted is logged into the camp’s computer. An invoice detailing the total charges for the session(s) and any “extras” you have selected is then mailed to you, along with a statement showing your outstanding balance net of the deposit you previously sent.

For those who register between Sept. 1 – Dec. 31, half of the outstanding balance will be due January 31<sup>st</sup>, and the remainder is due on or before June 28<sup>th</sup>, the Opening Day of First Session.

For those who register between January 1 – April 30<sup>th</sup>, half of the outstanding balance is due in thirty days, and the remainder is due on or before June 26<sup>th</sup>. Registrations received after May 1<sup>st</sup> are due in full upon receipt.

Note: We accept Visa, Master Card, personal checks, or wire transfers.

Note well: *If you are the parent of a child who is attending Second Session only, full payment for your child is still due by **June 28th**.* This is because the vast majority of expenses for the entire camp season have already been incurred by this date!

Note especially well: No child will be allowed to begin her stay at camp with an outstanding balance on her account. If you bring your child to camp, please check with Mary Mead in the camp office before leaving that your account has been paid in full. If your child comes to camp with friends or flies on her own, please check with Mary that your account is completely paid before sending her from home.

Note well as well: Often campers wish to change the amount of “extra” activities they have signed up for once they have been at camp a little while. Unless you have given us specific instructions to allow them to do so, we will contact you to see if the changes they

wish to make are acceptable to you. If so, we will bill you for any increased fees, or credit your account for any reduction in charges.

### Cancellation Policy

The deposit you pay to reserve a spot for your child is not refundable if you cancel her reservation anytime after January 1<sup>st</sup>. If you cancel her reservation for any reason prior to April 15<sup>th</sup>, we will refund whatever additional amounts you have paid by that time. If you cancel her reservation for health or for family emergency reasons subsequent to April 15<sup>th</sup> but before camp begins; we will also refund any payments you have made, other than your deposit. If your daughter has to withdraw from camp for medical or family emergency reasons after her session has begun, we will prorate the tuition for which the parents are responsible and refund the balance. A non-refunded deposit may be rolled over as credit against the following year's tuition.

### Discounts

Parents who register their child for the following summer by August 31<sup>st</sup>, and who agree to make five installment payments of her charges over the next ten months, are entitled to an "Early Payment Discount". This discount normally equals the tuition increase for the coming year.

If you elect to take this discount, you will receive installment payment coupons and reminder notices for your convenience. Should you fail to make one of the scheduled payments, you will automatically be switched to the regular payment plan, forfeiting the discount (but not your child's reservation) unless you have made prior arrangements with the Director.

We also offer a 10% "sister's discount" off of whichever child's tuition is lower. Please note that this discount does not apply to the deposit which is required for each child, and you cannot take both a sister's discount and an early payment discount for the same child. You may, however, take a sister's discount for one child and an early payment discount for another!

### Camperships

The 'Mid Pines Foundation, our non-profit alumnae membership group, administers an annual campership program that helps make camping at Waukeela available to children who might otherwise be unable to attend. Awards are normally considered lifetime camperships for campers who wish to continue their camp experience, are in good standing based on recommendations from the staff, and who can demonstrate ongoing financial need. There is always far more demand for these funds than supply; families seeking such assistance are encouraged to apply for it as soon as possible during the off-season by contacting the Director. Please note that previous campership recipients whose applications for ongoing support arrive after the deadline of 12/15 may lose their prior funding commitment.

## ***Digital Technology***

Campers are **not** permitted to use cell phones while they are at Waukeela. This is not asking a great deal of them, because cell phones don't work in the Pine Grove anyway!!

If your daughter is traveling on her own to or from camp, we understand that you may wish her to have a cell phone on her travels. In this case, when she arrives at camp she is expected to bring her cell phone to the office for safe-keeping. In no case should she keep it with her in her cabin. We will make sure she gets it back when camp is over.

If you are planning to drop off and pick up your daughter, there is absolutely no reason for her to bring a cell phone with her. If for some reason she does bring one and we find it, it will be held in the office. If she wants it back at the end of camp, you will be asked to make that request.

Campers are allowed to bring Ipods to camp although we do not encourage it. Before sending one with your daughter, you and she should be aware that they are very easy to damage or lose at camp. You should also be aware that she will only be able to play her Ipod using earphones at Rest Hour or when she is trying to sleep at night. She may also play it without earphones if asked to do so in a Performing Arts activity (Dance, Music, Drama, or Film) by the counselor. If she owns a device which allows her to watch video as well, she will not be able to use this function. If caught doing so, the Ipod will be held for her at the office and returned when camp is over, but she will not be able to use it again for the rest of the summer.

Many campers bring digital cameras, and some also bring Instamatics. This year one of our counselors will give classes in digital photography, so your daughter will have the chance to learn more about her digital camera if she brings one. These get damaged and lost as well, however, so it is not a great idea to send an expensive camera with your child. Girls without their own will be able to use Waukeela's digital cameras both in these classes as well as during their free time.

At no time are campers or counselors allowed to take a picture of anyone who is undressed or partially clothed. Inappropriate use of a camera will cause it to be confiscated, not to be returned until the end of camp.

Finally, game players, walkie-talkies, and other forms of digital entertainment devices are not allowed at camp. If found, we will take them and not give them back.

## Directions to Waukeela

### ***From Boston***

- 1) Get on Rte 95 North towards Portsmouth, N.H. This is most easily accessed from either Rte 495 or Rte 128, which ring the Boston metropolitan area.
- 2) Go left at major junction in Portsmouth, N.H., following signs for Route 4-16-White Mountains. Do not follow 95 North into Maine.
- 3) Follow Route 16 North to intersection with Rte 25 East near Center Ossipee. Turn right onto Rte 25.
- 4) Go 6 miles east to intersection with Rte 153 North. Turn left and go 10 miles to village of Eaton Center.
- 5) Pass through village with white church and Crystal Lake on your right. Just after Rte 153 bears left away from the lake, watch for sign in tree and turn right into camp's driveway.

### ***From Portland Airport***

- 1) Follow airport exit signs to Rte 22. Turn left onto 22 West.
- 2) Follow 22 West until it merges with Rte 114. Continue until roads separate.
- 3) Follow 114 North until it meets Rte 25.
- 4) Turn left and follow Rte 25 West. Cross into NH and stay on Rte 25 until it intersects with Rte 153 North in vicinity of Freedom.
- 5) Turn right onto Rte 153 North and go 10 miles to village of Eaton Center.
- 6) Proceed as #5 above from Boston.

### ***From Manchester Airport***

- 1) Follow airport exit signs to Route 93 North. Follow Rte 93 North to Meredith Exit - Rte. 104.
- 2) Follow Rte 104 East to intersection with Rte. 25 in Meredith. Follow 25 North (east) to junction with Rte 16.
- 3) Take Rte 16 South to intersection with Rte 25 East. Turn left on 25 East and see # 4 from Boston above.
